Good Friday Charity

Giving back has always been at the core of St. Gregorios Austin family. Thanking our Lord for all the blessings he has given us, we continued our tradition of using the Good Friday offertory to help people in need. On behalf of the Good Friday Charity (GFC) committee, I am humbled to present the GFC 2015 Report.

The Need

Every year, we receive many applications as part of the GFC, which contain life situations and stories of tragedies of ordinary people. This year was no different. Sharing a few of the stories that help each of us reinforce how our help is making a difference.

- A child (studying in 1st grade) crosses the road seeing her mother after getting off a school bus and a KSRTC bus hits her and goes over her leg and finally doctors had to amputate her leg.
- A student gets 96.7% marks, but is unable to continue her education since her parents can't afford her higher education
- Multiple widows living in houses that could collapse any time or having no houses to live in, having to deal with disabled children, losing husband to cancer, having to deal with brain tumor treatment of their children, and many more.
- An applicant sends a request to us for help, but passes away before we can get them any help and is survived by his wife and two children who are mentally challenged and unable to operate any financial matters making it hard for us to reach out to them.
- Daily wage workers living with medical conditions not able to afford an surgery
- A wife who is sole bread winner for a family, whose husband's one leg is amputated and has limited vision, passes away from a snake bite.
- The parents of a 38 year old girl not able to conduct their daughters marriage due to financial challenges
- Cancer, Tumor, Heart disease, Stroke, Kidney disease, TB, Nerve disease, you name it, the chances that we might have an applicant with this, is highly likely.



GFC 2015 Goals

Our primary goal remains the same: Share Christ's love with people in need. This year, in its natural evolution, we set few additional goals to enhance the project.

- 1. Enable a faster distribution of funds by June 30th
- 2. Encourage the participation of our members in the selection of the beneficiaries and the operation of the project.
- 3. Undertake one local charity project in the community we live and worship and enable our youth to participate in it.
- 4. Enhance the operational excellence of the project and drive transparency and follow-up.


To achieve these goals, a GFC committee was created, which worked on refining the process and came up with a criteria based ranking model.

GFC 2015 Summary and Plan

We received 46 applications this year before the deadline from 13 dioceses belonging to five categories. We received \$10,000 this year as part of the Good Friday charity collection.



We allocated \$9000 for supporting the applications received. From this year, we decided to fund a local



charity project in our local community and year marked \$500 for the project. We also established an emergency charity fund to fund any emergencies that may occur after the regular distributions are made and year marked \$500 towards it.

The distribution of the Good Friday charity was done at multiple locations. We lived up to target of issuing the checks by June 30th. We thank the bishops, priest and other church officials for distributing the help in a timely manner.



Back to School Project

In an effort to multiply the impact we can bring to people in need, in addition to the financial support, we wanted to get our youth involved in these activities so that we can bring their time and talents to serve the people in need. We selected the Manor ISD school supplies project as the local project for this year.

This year, St. Gregorios Austin joined the local school district to support students in need by donating school supplies. The Sunday school and MGOCSM students packed school supplies at



the church on 8/9/2015 after the Holy Qurbana as part of the volunteer activity for the month of August. Volunteers shopped the best deals and packed kits according to the Manor ISD school supplies list. The volunteers volunteered at the Manor ISD on 8/20/2015 to pack more school supplies.



In order to create better awareness and transparency, we present various breakdowns based on location, category and total amount distributed during this year.


Diocese Level breakdown


Category Based

We received applications in 5 categories. Listed below is the summary of number of applications received for each category and the number of applications selected from each category.




Total Amount distributed per category




Applications Supported
